



## Student Health Benefits

UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA

Our office is unable to verify your fall 2021 eligibility for enrollment in the Graduate Assistant Health Plan (GAHP). **Your coverage was terminated on August 31, 2021.** You can request a formal letter of termination from Blue Cross (651-662-5004) in 2-3 business days.

To be eligible for the GAHP, you must hold a qualifying assistantship or fellowship through the graduate school at 25% or greater and you must be registered for the minimum required credits for an assistantship. Detailed eligibility criteria can be found on our [website](#).

**If you have a qualifying graduate assistantship or fellowship and feel that you received this message in error, please notify the Office of Student Health Benefits immediately.**

If you were enrolled in the GAHP during the Spring 2021 semester and are no longer eligible for the plan, you may purchase the Continuation of Coverage plan at your own expense (including coverage for dependents that were previously covered under your GAHP). To enroll in the Continuation of Coverage, submit an enrollment form no later than October 31, 2021. Visit our [website](#) for more information.

**Current University of Minnesota Students:** If eligible\* you will be enrolled in the University-sponsored [Student Health Benefit Plan](#). A charge for the plan will be posted to your student account and you will receive a new card from Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Minnesota. If you have other health insurance coverage, go to your [Student Center](#) to complete the Health Coverage Declaration by September 30, 2021.
